JAY GAIDMORE has served as the Marian and Alan McLeod Director of the Special Collections Research Center in the William & Mary Libraries since July 1, 2013. He has been an archivist for over twenty years, having served as a Private Papers Archivist at the Library of Virginia, the University Archivist at Brown University, and the head of University Archives and Records Management Services at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He moved to Virginia from New Hampshire in 1995 to get his M.A. in History from Old Dominion University in Norfolk. He received his degree in 1999, writing his thesis on the Virginia Conservative Party of the 1960's, using the 20th century political papers at Swem Library. He then attended the University of South Carolina in Columbia for his Masters in Library and Information Sciences, specializing in digital libraries and digital preservation, graduating in December 2005.

He is a member of the Virginia State Historical Records Advisory Board, having been appointed by Governor Terry McAuliffe in 2015 and reappointed in 2018. He is also the current President of the Williamsburg Historic Records Association, an organization dedicated to the preservation of the post-colonial history of Williamsburg and the surrounding area.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I have to admit I felt unprepared to write a final President's Message. It certainly doesn't feel like I've been President that long, but as I look back over the last several years (two terms of two years each) I guess it has been a little while. I am extremely proud of the Society's Board of Directors and our efforts to not just provide excellent meetings with interesting and engaging speakers, but to also care so passionately about protecting the county's past and sharing it with the present (and future) citizens of King William County and others. I look to the road ahead, though, and I am even more excited. Our push to see Acquinton Church placed on the Virginia Historic Landmarks Register is underway, and potential improvements on the property to continue its use as a quality, inexpensive wedding venue and historic site. The Harry and Alma Coon Fund will greatly expand the number and type of opportunities for the society, and our board is busily considering the adventures this will support in 2018 and beyond. Whether our new website (coming very soon) or better storage capacity for our records, we have many great reasons to keep you involved and to grow our little society in the years ahead.

It is an honor to serve the society as its president, and I look forward to my role as "past president" over the next two years. I hope to see you at the next meeting when we vote to install new board members and move the King William County Historical Society to the next stage. Sincerely,

Minutes of the King William County Historical Society Membership Meeting Sunday, April 15, 2018

The Membership Meeting of the King William County Historical Society was held at 2:30 p.m. on Sunday, April 15, 2018 at the King William County Administration Building Boardroom. There were approximately 26 members and guests present.

President David Brown called the meeting to order at 2:35 p.m. and welcomed several new members and guests as well as the membership.

The Minutes of the January 21, 2018 Membership Meeting were approved as submitted.

Reporting for the Museum, Anne Jackson announced that she conducted a workshop and seven new docents were trained. The Museum now has enough docents to keep the Museum open on Sundays throughout the season. More docents are needed for Saturdays. The Museum hours are posted on the Facebook page.

Unfinished Business: Carl Fisher reported that painting is underway at the Lanesville Christadelphian Church. The sign will be installed outside when the painting is finished. David Brown reported the Lanesville Christadelphian Church is on the agenda for the State Review Board Meeting in June 2018 and should be listed on the Virginia Historic Landmarks Register at that time. Listing on the National Register of Historic Places should follow before the end of 2018.

New Business: David Brown reported that the Society's Facebook page now has 116 followers. The new website is under construction. David Brown noted the death of Dorothy Krewatch, a long time, active Society member. He announced the formation of a Nominating Committee for the upcoming election of Society officers and board members that will take place at the July 15, 2018 meeting. He encouraged all to volunteer to serve as an officer or Board member.

Patricia Haile introduced Mr. Charles Belfield who presented the program. Mr. Belfield, from Richmond County, is an officer in the James Monroe Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution, the Richard Henry Lee Chapter of SAR, the Northern Neck Historical Society and the War of 1812 Society in Virginia. In the program, Mr. Belfield portrayed his ancestor Captain John Belfield who served with George Washington for three years as a scout and spy and was at Valley Forge. He walked home to the Northern Neck in 1779, passing through King William County bringing messages from local soldiers and news of the war. Mr. Belfield's authentic uniform and program are the result of ten years of research and study. He encouraged all to investigate their family history.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:45 p.m. after which the group enjoyed conversations with Mr. Belfield and each other and refreshments organized by Patricia Haile.
